From COVID-19 to Tuberculosis: World experts in bioaerosols to address the 52nd Union World Conference on Lung Health

Media Registration now open

Thursday, 30 September 2021 (Paris, France) --COVID-19 and tuberculosis are today the world's two leading infectious disease killers. The novel coronavirus pandemic has refocused attention on how infectious diseases transmit from person to person and has catalysed innovations in sampling and diagnostics. The 52nd edition of the <u>Union World Conference on Lung Health</u> (WCLH) will feature a special Plenary Session exploring how pathogen bioaerosols arise, persist in different environments, and infect other hosts, and how the innovations and knowledge gained from the COVID-19 response can be harnessed to improve TB infection prevention and control, and TB diagnosis.

The theme of the 52nd Union World Conference on Lung Health is *Lung Health for All:* Solutions for a New Era. With the world still in the grip of a lung health pandemic, it is also confronting questions about systemic race relations and how the same vulnerable communities that bear the brunt of TB and HIV have now been hit the hardest by COVID-19.

The conference will explore solutions to these challenges with the latest <u>science and</u> <u>research</u> around TB treatment, vaccines and zoonotic disease outbreaks. It will also feature basic and translational TB research (<u>TBScience</u>) and the most pressing issues facing affected communities (<u>Community Connect</u>).
